He is remembered on his daughter and wife's grave in Section 10 near the back fence. I don't think he was a Bramley lad as I can't, so far, find any record of his birth or that of his father in Bramley. He married his wife Gladys at Christ Church, Upper Armley Q3 1938, Reg. Leeds South 9b 1350.
