5.1 Description of Memorial (For information about types refer to guidelines)
<p>The Memorial consists of:</p> <p>A stone pillar, surmounted by a hemispheric disk.</p> <p>The pillar has scrolls on its four faces, each one carrying details of over 100 fallen on metal effect plaques.</p> <p>The hemispheric disk has a copper metal effect, with a band separating the upper and lower halves of the disk – the disk represents in the lower half, the dish that holds an eternal flame; the upper half represents sunlight reflecting onto the names.</p> <p>The names are shown as follows:</p> <p>Forename; Initials; Last name; Honours; Age when died, Date of Death – if any ages or Date of Death details are not known (8 fallen in total) then blanks are put in place instead.</p> <p>Surrounding the pillar on three sides is a curved polished granite wall, with three engraved plaques in place representing in order from left to right, Royal Navy, Army, and Royal Air Force.</p> <p>The following is inscribed in gold lettering on the curved polished granite wall.</p> <p>“In everlasting memory of brave Bramley people who gave their lives in pursuit of peace – we shall not forget”</p> <p>There is chrome handrail surmounting the curved wall, with stone steps and a stone wall behind.</p> <p>At the foot of the pillar is a polished granite stepped base for placement of wreaths and tributes.</p> <p>The boundary wall extends to the right and left of Memorial area and is itself boarded with flower beds.</p> <p>Please see attached photographs.</p>
